I. A Brief History

FAEDS is a K-20 professional educational association made up of practicing information systems and computer system specialists, and vendors in support of school district, community college, and university operations and functions. FAEDS members join together in order to network, plan activities, and encourage best practices for the mutual benefit of all those who practice and provide leadership for these professions throughout Florida.

Founded in 1963, when 14 counties planning on utilizing centralized data processing met in Tallahassee. They recognized the need for a data processing association and submitted an application for a state charter. Thomas D. Bailey (Tallahassee) is credited with the initial idea. Officially, the State association was formerly chartered in 1964 and signed by Myron Ashmore (Fort Lauderdale), Thomas Bailey, William English (Fort Lauderdale), Henry Fox (Miami), Robert Gates (Tallahassee), William McFatter (Fort Lauderdale), John Phillips (Clearwater), Robert Sims (Tallahassee), Thomas Smith (Titusville), and Gerald Wilson (Tampa). William J. English was elected the first president of the new organization.

FAEDS is the oldest Florida professional association dedicated to the advancement of educational technology. FAEDS originally was a state-level organization off the parent organization, the National Association of Educational Data Systems (AEDS), and there was a joint FAEDS-AEDS conference in 1969. A FAEDS member, Dr. Everitt Yarborough (Tallahassee), served as national association president that year.

In 1979 FAEDS began the tradition of an annual fall conference – which has continued since that time (over 35 years).

FAEDS began a close working relationship with the Florida Educational Computing Network (FECN) which was the precursor to the Florida Information Resource Network

(FIRN). This was a key working relationship in that – through FAEDS - all school districts had direct input in statewide Internet and website hosting planning, and policies. In June, 2007 website hosting for the all K-12 schools was officially transferred from FLDOE to FIRN.

FAEDS has always maintained it's focus on meeting educational information systems and technology needs in all Florida schools: K-12, colleges, and universities. While the association membership included local and national vendor representatives, technology experts, and the State Department staff, the association mission has been directed and governed by in-field representatives via a Board of Directors. The Directors oversee the membership, policies, annual conferences, workshops, position papers, and monitor legislative mandates and maintain association communications on data system issues.

The objectives of FAEDS, adopted on November 8, 2000 and formally approved and submitted as part of Articles of Incorporation, are:

1. To promote and encourage appropriate use of information technologies, and systems to facilitate the improvement of comprehensive educations processes at schools, colleges, and universities;

- 2. To bring together, for their mutual benefit, both operational and professional specialists concerned with educational information technologies and systems and representatives from manufacturing and service companies;
- 3. To provide for sharing and exchanging ideas, techniques, materials and procedures among educational groups currently using or planning to use various information technologies and systems;
- 4. To promote general recognition of the vital role of the educational information technology specialists in supporting schools, colleges and universities and of the high level of competence required for this role;
- 5. To facilitate, at local and state levels, communication and cooperation among educational entities, agencies, organizations, professions, and the public regarding the purpose and use of information technologies and systems;
- 6. To stimulate the development of adequate programs of instruction by those responsible for the professional training of educators, information technology specialists and instructors;
- 7. To provide leadership in the efficient management of educational data, recognizing the need for appropriate ethical standards, and compatible data requirements;
- 8. To identify areas of concern and inform the appropriate entities of special studies which may be indicated; and
- 9. To work with the public and private sector distributors of information technologies in establishing and maintaining proper technical standards and in meeting new requirements in hardware and software.

One of the prominent functions of FAEDS is the recognition provided colleagues and state leaders in the field of educational information and computing. These awards are made annually and include:

- The Robert E. Sims, Memorial Award to Outstanding Service;
- Honorary Lifetime Memberships;
- The Raymond Parker Award;
- The William J. English Award;
- The Computer Teacher of the Year Award; and
- The Jack Kelley Outstanding Technology Award.

Over the fifty plus years of the association, the FAEDS organization and membership have been very involved in the design and implementation of some of the more significant statewide advancements in the areas of educational technology and information systems:

- In the early 70's Florida became one of the first states to design and develop a uniform statewide data collection and reporting system for all student, instructional, staff, and operational systems.
- The Florida Information Resources Network (FIRN) provided the networking infrastructure, policies and guidelines for both school and Internet communications.
- The Florida Distance Learning project provided the guidance and groundwork for wireless education.
- The SSAT, FAIR and PMRN statewide assessment projects which were the predecessors to the statewide online assessments (RTTT);
- The Sunshine Connections project which advanced statewide interoperable user identification and security for exceptional and regular student analytic systems.
- The statewide Race to the Top projects (2009-2015) which raised core standards and provided extensive online interactive support for educational school and program administrators, teachers, students, and parents(CPALMS).

• In the past ten years, FAEDS has served a much more critical role in promoting shared understanding and practical solutions in response to an explosive increase in new technologies, implementation and security issues, new mandates, and ever increasing funding shortages. FAEDS has become an essential communication, training, and planning vehicle for K-20 educational technology, as reflected in such annual themes as: "Optimizing Resources to meet Florida's Education Challenges (2009)," "Are you ready?! Technology options to meet the Explosion of Florida K-20 Education Requirements" (2010), "E-TextBook Mobile Devices & Social Media Cloud Computing" (2012).

FAEDS continues as a self-governing body in providing the leadership and support for all those involved in the advancement of educational data systems and technology in Florida, and remains an outstanding professional association example nationally.

- 14 counties planning on utilizing data processing met in Tallahassee on June 27 and 28. They recognized the need for a data processing association and submitted an application for a state charter.
- Thomas D. Bailey is credited with initial idea.
- William J. English was elected first president of new organization.

1964

- FAEDS came into official existence. Charter signed by Myron Ashmore, Thomas Bailey, William English, Henry Fox, Robert Gates, William McFatter, John Phillips, Robert Sims, Thomas Smith, and Gerald Wilson.
- Bill English continues as president.

1965

• Bill English reelected for 1 additional year.

1966

- Dr. Henry Fox elected as second FAEDS president.
- Annual meeting in Tampa.

1967

• Everett Yarbrough elected president.

- Joint FAEDS-AEDS workshop held April 28 through May 1 in Miami Beach. Theme was "Real Time Processing."
- Everett Yarbrough served as president of the national organization, AEDS.
- First Robert W. Sims Memorial Award presented to Dr. Henry Fox.
- Committee system fully adopted to perform various organizational functions.
- Robert W. Sims Scholarship first offered. Available to second year students in terminal Data Processing programs. Amount of scholarship was \$500. It was to be paid back without interest upon completion of program.
- Fall Conference held in Clearwater on October 13 and 14.

- Fall Conference held in Sarasota.
- Everett Yarbrough (Leon) given Sims Memorial Award.

- First Sims Scholarship grants given to Diane Rupert (Hillsborough Community College) and David Cooper (Tallahassee Community College).
- Dr. William R. Odom elected president-elect.
- Spring workshop held in Daytona Beach. Fall workshop held in West Palm Beach.
- Sims Memorial Award presented to Dr. Alton Kindred.
