ABOUT THE SPEAKERS

Howard Milligan is the Director of the Florida Educational Computing Cooperative, and is responsible for its overall success. He and his staff can provide services to assist us at the local level.

George Baldwin, CPA, of Smook, Davis, and Nixon, is considered an expert in data processing auditing. He has made presentations at DPMA meetings, and "tells it like it is."

Barry Harbough is Industry Manager for Southern Bell and makes his headquarters in Atlanta. The data communications presentation is certainly in expert hands.

Ray Alpeter of Management Sciences America, Incorporated makes his headquarters in Atlanta, but his activities are not limited to that city. He is National Systems Coordinator for the Payroll/Personnel Management Reporting System of MSA. Mr. Alpeter is currently responsible for designing and implementing national training programs for both systems, as well as analyzing systems specifications for future development. He has a background of 23 years of all phases of data processing, and has made numerous presentations to groups, including American Management Association.

Mason, "Grand Lady of Software - Grace Hopper: It's rewarding trying to do things in a new way," states her case well. She is currently on active duty with the Naval Automation Command as NAVDAC-OOH. Mr. Frank Mills, LBM, is an expert on Installation Management. He has been involved in several training experiences, and has practical knowledge as well.

Mr. George McAliley, IBM, is considered outstanding in the field of Data Base Management. He has taught courses on DBMS at Palm Beach Junior College as well as having much practical experience in the field.

Mr. Den Kitmer, IBM, has received in-depth training and has experience in the field of Installation Management. He will be a credit to the Installation Management track.

FAEDS is indeed fortunate to have people of this caliber making presentations to us as we increase our knowledge of our ever-changing field. We wish to acknowledge the efforts of their respective organizations for making them available to us. Thanks to them, a successful conference is on the way.

POARD OF DIRECTORS ACTIONS

FAEDS Board of Directors met March 7-8 in Tallahassee. Acting on a wide-ranging agenda, the Board took the following action:

- Considered the possibility of sponsoring the AEDS conference for 1984 in the Orlando area.
- Received a letter from the Florida Association of School Administrators suggesting closer cooperation with that group.
- Declined to take a position either for or against appointive Commissioner and State Board of Education.
- Recognized regional data centers as separate entities for membership purposes in FAEDS, with four memberships allowed for a \$20 fee.
- Approved plans to conduct balloting by mall (see companion article in this issue).
- Heard final plans for the FAEDS Spring Conference at Palm Beach.
- Voted to appoint a Program Committee to serve for the fall, 1978, and spring, 1979, conferences.
- Suggested Pensacola as a site for the fall, 1978, and Brevard County for spring, 1979, conferences.
- Authorized the Program Committee to spend up to \$600 for program speakers for the fall, 1978, conference.
